

Port of Camas/Washougal RV* PARKING REGULATIONS

April 1, 2004

Availability

- RV parking is NOT available weekends except for participants of fishing tournaments and Opening and Closing Day events.
- Parking is limited to the designated area only (see map). Approximately 10 spaces are available.

Rate

- \$15/night to camp.
- \$20/night to camp + Daily Launch Ramp use.
- Complete information requested on **self-pay** envelope and deposit it with payment into the drop box located to the left of the Port Office front door.

Length of Stay (Applies to any stay over 4 hours)

- Maximum length of stay is 4 days.

Self-Containment

- All RV units must be entirely self-contained (water and sewage).
- Electrical service is NOT available.
- Discharge of "gray water" and/or sewage is not allowed – except at the RV dump station.

Parking

- Parking is allowed at the western-most section of the north parking lot (see map).
- Parking is NOT allowed on the gravel thoroughfares.
- Trailers may be unhitched from tow vehicles if necessary.

Pets

- Dogs and other pets must be leashed at all times.
- Noise, barking, or other disturbances by pets are not allowed.
- Owners must clean up and dispose of pet droppings.

Garbage Disposal

- All garbage and pet droppings must be disposed of in the trash receptacle located next to the ticket machine kiosk.

Restrooms

- Public restrooms are located north of the RV dump station.
- Restrooms are handicap accessible.

Open Fires

- Fires are NOT permitted.
- Contained barbecues are allowed.

Quiet Hours

- Quiet hours are observed from 10:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. No generators, please.
- Loud, boisterous, or lewd conduct is not allowed.

Safety & Loss

- Persons using or visiting Port premises or its facilities do so at their own risk.
- The Port does not assume any responsibility for loss or damage due to fire, accident, or theft, to property or persons.

*RV Definition

- A vehicular type unit primarily designed for recreational camping, travel, or seasonal use, which has its own mode of power or is mounted on or towed by another vehicle. The basic entities are travel or "fifth wheel" trailer, camping trailer, camper, motor home and multi-use vehicles.
- The pitching of tents, open camping and sleeping in passenger vehicles (other than those described above) is NOT allowed.
