**WALSTRA NAMED AS PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT DIRECTOR
FOR PORT OF CAMAS-WASHOUGAL**

JUNE 6, 2007 – Rich Gunderson, president of the Port of Camas-Washougal Board of Commissioners, recently announced the appointment of Scot Walstra as the port's new Director of Planning & Development. Walstra will officially assume his new position at the port on June 11, and he will directly report to the Port of Camas-Washougal Board of Commissioners. Walstra will work closely with port's executive director, Sheldon Tyler, who manages the overall port operations including a 400-acre industrial park, a 79-hangar general aviation airport, and a 350-slip pleasure boat marina.



Walstra's responsibilities include planning and developing long and short term land-use strategies, and analyzing economic development impacts to meet the port's business objectives. Walstra will also actively market any available port industrial property and building space, in addition to managing the feasibility study of the proposed RiverWalk waterfront development efforts.

"Scot will be a great addition to our Port team," said Gunderson. "Walstra's diverse strengths in business development will help us focus on maximizing land use at the port, and definitely contribute to the Port's mission of providing jobs and economic development to this community."

Walstra's professional experience includes 26 years of service at NW Natural in various capacities including Director of Business Development for Clark County district; Industrial/Commercial Segment Manager; New Construction Segment Manager; and residential energy consultant. Prior to that, Walstra worked several years for Yacht Constructors Inc. in Portland, a builder of large sailboats in the region.

Since Walstra's retirement in March 2006, he has been involved in business development consulting, as well as local and regional legislative issues. "I am excited by the potential for business development at the Port of Camas-Washougal," said Walstra. "I look forward to participating in bringing more business opportunities to the Camas-Washougal area, especially to enhance the waterfront for these communities."

Walstra has been active in local business & civic organizations for years, including the Greater Vancouver Chamber of Commerce, Columbia River Crossing Taskforce, Clark County Economic Development Investment Fund, SW WA contractors Association, The Responsible Growth Forum and many others.

Formed in 1935 by a vote of the local community, the Port of Camas-Washougal features a 400-acre industrial park, a 79-hangar general aviation airport, and a 350-slip pleasure boat marina. Popular with recreational and general aviation pilots, Grove Field airport also has a state-of-the-art fueling station and 14 tie-downs. The Port of Camas-Washougal marina, largest on the Washington side of the Columbia River, is adjacent to two restaurants, a launch ramp, a marina park, fueling station, guest docks, and homeport to the Vancouver and Dolphin Yacht Clubs.
